What problems are you trying to solve?

Even with strict guidelines, communities are facing difficulties in the race against coronavirus in preventing community spread. Many supermarkets have imposed measures that restrict the number of shoppers that can be in the store. But, they often have lines in the parking lot which is dangerous for vulnerable populations, including older people or those with preexisting conditions. Many businesses/parks already have staff members at the door counting the number of people entering the establishment to ensure that they meet health guidelines. Sharing this information would allow users to access the real-time data of how busy a certain location is at any given time. They would also be able to look at graphs that show the past "busy-ness" trends, informing their decisions of where to go and when in order to come into contact with as few people as possible. Businesses could also utilize the "bulletin" function of the app to publish any health guidelines that are specific to the store (capacity, hygiene protocols, etc.). As the summer season begins, many seasonal businesses in vacation areas like Rhode Island and Massachusetts will open for the season. It would be much more time-efficient and convenient for families to be able to check one single app for updates on restaurants, leaving less time for wondering and more time to spend with each other.

This app will be coded in App Inventor. As the app initializes, the home page will load with a button for a user to log in or make an account. When a user signs up, their information is put in a TinyDB, which raises security concerns. The user inputs very little information, making them less vulnerable to hacking. Below the buttons are labels and links which outline ways to prevent the spread of coronavirus and bring the user to the reopening phases for Connecticut. There's a button to search for local restaurants to see their dining choices and hours. After logging in or clicking the search restaurant button, a new page will open to search by name or filters. For each restaurant in the search, there's key information about the restaurant and dining options. At the bottom of every page, there's a button for the user to return to the home page. What problems are you trying to solve?

The problem being addressed is the misinformation regarding changing business times and policies during the Covid-19 response. Furthermore, with the influx of news media and everyday updates from the government, local citizens may have trouble understanding which stores they have access to, as well as any new policies the state government has enacted on outside businesses.

What inspired you to address this problem?

This idea was inspired by the recent May 20th reopening in Connecticut for certain stores other than essential businesses. It was also inspired by the recent news / arguments about the challenges the U.S. states will face in regards to keeping their economy afloat during the Covid-19 response. Although Connecticut is one of the few states who are not as affected economically by the reduction in tourism and entertainment, many citizens are concerned about the survivability of the local businesses. This was kept in mind while I was brainstorming the idea of a "tracker" app that made it easier for people to be exposed to local names. I was also inspired by my fellow students, who are eager to slowly transition back to a somewhat normal life by being able to buy and eat the things that they normally did.

To continue, I was inspired by the sheer amount of family-run restaurants that I saw around Connecticut, and how many of them were suffering because of the inability to sell their products. One restaurant that my family frequents to a lot (Pho 501 in Hartford), adopted a take-out system that reduced the contact time between other customers and restaurant workers. However, I noticed that despite their large social media presence in Facebook and Instagram, the times that they are open were inaccurate on websites such as Yelp or Google. Therefore, this inspired me to think about an app that would have the most updated information on local businesses, so that interested customers did not have to traverse different food review websites or call the restaurant to get the correct hours / policies of the restaurant.

Describe your idea and functionality:

The app would be relatively simple, and would serve the sole function of giving customers information about which local businesses were open, their hours, their location, and any special policies that the customers should know about before going there. The display would be a simple map with icons symbolizing what type of business is located there (a fork and knife symbol is a restaurant, a hammer symbol is a hardware store, etc).
